ENGLISH

Quarries can provide useful starting point for English and Language work.

Reflecting on a visit will stimulate a wide range of words.

These can be random and arise spontaneously.

They can be written on the whiteboard as a class activity or on individual whiteboards or paper.

They can be structured into adjectives and adverbs, nouns and verbs.

Feelings and impressions can be expressed through adjectives and adverbs.

Objects, people and things can be expressed through nouns.

Actions and doing words use verbs.

These words can be put into sentences to describe the experience.

Photographs of the visit can be selected to create a framework for the story

They can be used for poems – such as rhyming pairs and haikus.

Some examples follow:

These words can also be used for movement and dance. (SEE EXAMPLE MOVEMENT AND DANCE)

The rhythms of the words can be used to structure musical phrases.
